He spoke up about the future prospects of the course. The duties and responsibilities being a Company Secretary (CS), the benefits they enjoy and the sacrifices to be made .

The talk and discussion was led by an eminent personality and expert in the field **Dr. Mathew Kurian**. #### **ORGANISING COMPETITIONS**

## 3. CCL Commerce Cricket League

The Association organised a cricket tournament in which 4 teams participated. In the preliminary matches D3 beat D1 where as the Rest team defeated D2. In the finals held on 31st December, D3 team emerged victorious by defeating Rest of Commerce.



#### **INTER DEPARTMENT COMPETITIONS- IPL Auction**

Auction is a test to find the ability to allot available resources to the best choice. The task is to form an IPL team with 11 players i.e. 5Batsman, 4 bowlers, 1 wicket keeper and 1 all rounder. Each player is allotted a rank and they were allotted a notional sum of Rs.60 Cr. Participants were allowed to spent in between 40 - 60 Cr. The team having the lowest product- Mathematics Department of totals of rank of all players and total amount spent by them emerged as the winners.


